What is a Service Academy?

- Military College. 4 year elite academic institution in a military environment. Graduates receive Bachelor's degrees.
- Funded by the US Government. Tuition-free, room & board free.
- Trains future officers. Graduates become leaders in the military, serving 5+ year active duty commitment upon graduation.

Why a Service Academy?

- Leadership. The premier leadership development institution in the country.
- Prestige. Ivy-league prestige. Among most difficult schools to get accepted.
- Challenge. Intense environment surrounded by high achievers.

Admissions Requirements

- 1. Congressional nomination. Applicants require a Congressional nomination. Packages are due to your local Representative and Senators by Fall of your Senior year.
- 2. Academy application. Application entails numerous essays and application forms.
- 3. Liaison Officer interview. Applicants must do an interview with a military liaison officer.
- 4. Fitness Test. Applicants must perform a fitness test called a Candidate Fitness Assessment (CFA).
- 5. Medical Board. Applicants must do a series of medical exams to pass the medical board, called Department of Defense Medical Evaluation Review Board (DODMERB).

What type of candidate are Academies looking for?

Eligibility requirements

- US citizen
- Age. At least 17 and but less than 23 on July 1 of the year they matriculate
- No legal dependents (spouse, children)
- Good moral character (no felonies/misdemeanors/probations)

Desired Qualities

- Academic excellence. Admits have avg 3.8 GPA and avg 1330 SAT.
- Leadership potential. Admits show a track record of making an impact outside the classroom. Categories such as extracurriculars, employment, and community service.
- Intrinsic motivation to serve. Admits display a passion for the military with past involvement and future plans.
